Happy 3rd Birthday to the Pantry!

The pantry will be celebrating the anniversary of its 3rd year of operation on April 4th. The pantry doors opened for the very first time on April 4, 2016 and we proudly served a grand total of 204 households that month. Three years later, in March 2019, we served a total of 1,043 households! That represents more than 5 times as many needy families assisted and our numbers are still growing.

Our clientele has grown because we offer a generous amount of fresh, healthy food and other useful items including baby food, toiletries and pet food, as well as assist those with chronic medical issues through the Prescription Pantry Program. A contributing factor to our growth is the improving economy in Reno/Sparks, which although positive in many ways has also resulted in a housing crisis, causing sky-high rent costs. The typical cost of rent in Reno today is just under \$1,700 per month, up about 30% from 5 years ago. Because wages are not increasing at that rapid rate, the higher cost of housing has become a major hardship for many in our area. We are glad we are here to help those whose income doesn't stretch far enough to buy healthy fresh food for their families.

Commodities are Cool

Saint Francis of Assisi Food Pantry participates in The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) sponsored by the US Department of Agriculture. This program provides a wide variety of fresh and shelf-stable foods, referred to as "commodities", to low income Americans at no cost. The food is provided to food banks in each state, which then redistribute the food to food pantries such as ours. We obtain commodities from our partner, the Food Bank of Northern Nevada, which serves all of Northern Nevada and the Eastern Sierra region of California. The commodities we receive supplement the rest of the fresh and non-perishable food available at the pantry.
