Santa Brings Joy to the Pantry!

Our very own special Santa made several guest appearances at the pantry the week before Christmas. Santa visited with our clients' kids and they couldn't have been more awestruck. Each child received a toy of their choosing and left with a delighted smile on their face.

Over the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, we provided food to 475 families, which included 1,714 household members. Throughout 2022, we assisted 23,071 families consisting of 56,380 individual household members. It was a busy year and 2023 is continuing on a record-setting pace!

Positive Prescription Pantry Results

In 2018, the Food Bank of Northern Nevada began a pilot Prescription Pantry program which connects patients living with food insecurity to the nutritious food they need to help them better manage chronic conditions such as diabetes and heart disease. With prescription in hand from their medical provider, patients come to participating food pantries to obtain the healthy food prescribed for their situation. Better nutrition can improve health while reducing hospital visits, doctor visits and prescription drugs.

To date, nearly 39,000 patients have participated in the Prescription Pantry program, of which St. Francis of Assisi was an original partner, and the results show that patients with diabetes have reduced A1C scores indicating an improvement in their diabetes status. Prescription Pantry Program Washoe County 2022 Results

Food Bank of Northern Nevada operates the Prescription Pantry program with funding with a Fund for a Healthy Nevada grant from the State of Nevada. This innovative project brings together the Food Bank of Northern Nevada with seven of its partner agencies and five local healthcare providers in Washoe County to reduce food insecurity and improve patient health through prescriptions for healthier foods. Each patient at participating healthcare agencies is screened for food insecurity using the Hunger Vital SignTM tool. Patients who screen positive are issued a prescription for food at participating healthy food pantry locations. A1C data was collected for patients who visited a healthy food pantry four or more times within the 12-month period. Each partner agency operates as a Healthy Pantry, meaning they have foods on hand that can promote and improve health such as increased fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grains, lean or plant based proteins and low-fat dairy products.

Evaluation Results

Since visiting this pantry, have you 69% 31% been able to avoid skipping meals? YES NO

92% of participants reported that visiting the pantry is helping their family consume more fruit.

95% of participants reported that visiting the pantry is helping their family consume more vegetables.



55% of all patients who had at least two A1C's drawn have their A1C in a downward trend.

The greatest change in observed patients was:

After 21 visits to a pantry, a patient reduced their A1C from 12.1 to 5.7

Pantry Supports Hot Meals for the Homeless



Grocery Delivery Drivers Needed

For the past 9 months, the pantry has been participating in the *Ride United: Last Mile Delivery* program sponsored by a partnership between Door Dash and United Way of Northern Nevada and the Sierras. This program provided free delivery of groceries from the pantry to disabled homebound clients. However, to our great disappointment funding was not renewed.

Because this grocery delivery program is very valuable to our homebound disabled clients, we are hoping to continue it on our own or partner with another local non-profit. We have the food, but we urgently need volunteer drivers to deliver the groceries from the pantry to the homes of clients in the Reno area. We typically pack 3 bags of groceries per client and deliver to 6-8 clients per week.



Never Too Many Toiletries!

In mid-October, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Reno held a hygiene products drive for the pantry. They dropped off boxes and boxes of shampoo, lotion, soap and other toiletries greatly cherished by our clients, especially as inflation has increased prices so significantly. Amazon Smile Program is Ending

On January 18, Amazon announced that it is ending its long-running Amazon Smile program that provided a modest .5% donation to charities selected by its customers, based on their spending. The program was launched in 2013 and will end Feb. 20, 2023.

In the announcement, Amazon noted
