New Coronavirus Procedures at the Pantry

As the Stay-at-Home orders have continued, our pantry President Cindy Becher has redesigned previous standard procedures at the pantry to safely distribute food to our clients, and keep our volunteers safe, in this difficult time.

As in the past before COVID-19, clients can again come into the pantry to shop for their food, but with these changes:

- Clients are urged to wear a mask. If they do not arrive with a mask, one is given to them.
- If a group of family members arrive, only one family member is allowed into the pantry to shop. The others must wait outside.
- Social distancing is enforced both outside the pantry for those waiting in line, and for those inside the pantry shopping. Xs mark the spot on the floor!
- Instead of coming once per month, clients can now come to the pantry once a week.







Thanks to the generosity of our donors, our shelves are stocked and ready when clients arrive. More clients are returning to the pantry for assistance every week and we are very happy to see them safe and well!

Support the Pantry While You Shop!

If you are like many of us who shop online at Amazon, especially during this time of staying safe at home, we encourage you to log into Amazon Smile and choose St. Francis of Assisi Food Pantry as your designated charity. When you shop at Amazon Smile, which is identical to the regular Amazon website, the Amazon Smile Foundation will donate .5% of the dollar value of your eligible purchases to the pantry, at no cost to you.

Here's how to set it up:

- 1. Using your usual Amazon sign on information, log into https://smile.amazon.com/
- 2. Amazon will prompt you to choose a charity.
- Search for Saint Francis of Assisi Food Pantry Reno and select it. It will remain your selected charity until you change or delete it.
- 4. Log in and shop at https://smile.amazon.com/

That's it! Very easy and you will be helping support the pantry with every purchase you make. On a quarterly basis, the Amazon Smile Foundation combines donations generated from all purchases designated for the pantry during the previous 3 months and automatically sends a donation to us. Just be sure to always log into https://Smile.Amazon.com to make the magic happen!

New Delivering with Dignity Program

Launched on May 1 by Nevada Lieutenant Governor Kate Marshall, the State of Nevada has created a new temporary program to bring high-quality meals at no cost directly to the most vulnerable individuals and families in the Reno-Sparks and Las Vegas areas. In our area, the program is managed by the United Way of Northern Nevada and the Sierras with local community partners, particularly Liberty Food and Wine Exchange, who prepare and deliver the meals. The intent is to keep the most vulnerable in our community safe by reducing their exposure to COVID-19.

St. Francis of Assisi Food Pantry has recommended selected clients for this program based on various criteria, such as disability, lack of transportation, lack of family support and nutritional needs. We are proud to participate in this caring and compassionate program.


Online Giving is Convenient, Easy & Secure!
