### Volunteers Offered by the Amazon Community Together Program

We were very excited to be contacted by a representative of the new *Amazon Community Together* (ACT) program, which offers employee volunteers to local non-profit organizations. These volunteers are paid Amazon employees who are on light duty and unable to work their normal job at Amazon due to their temporary physical restrictions.

As stated in an email to us from Ariana Linn, Amazon Community Together Specialist, "We know that quite often our employees can be very helpful in our community when the physical nature of the work at our sites is temporarily too difficult due to these restrictions. We are hoping to include you in our program to help staff you with volunteers that can work a minimum of 20 hours/week."

Of course, we immediately said YES and will be working with Ms. Linn to coordinate scheduling these new temporary volunteers.

During the pandemic, one of our biggest challenges has been finding volunteers to pick up food donations, stock our shelves, and assist clients during pantry hours. # **Prescription Pantry Program Produces Significant Results**

We recently received feedback from our partner, the Food Bank of Northern Nevada, on the results of the Prescription Pantry program. St Francis of Assisi Food Pantry is one of only 7 food pantries in our area that were asked to participate in this program which began in the Spring of 2018. One of the pantries, FISH, is located in Carson City while the other 6 are in Reno and Sparks.

From July – September 2021, this innovative program assisted 10,098 clients who were referred to the pantries by their medical providers to obtain fresh, healthy food to improve their health status. Over the 3-month period, an impressive 507,876 pounds of food was distributed to these clients, which equates to 423,230 meals (using an average of 1.2 pounds of food per meal.) Way to go!

In addition, FBNN volunteers in pantries including St. Francis of Assisi submitted 486 applications for SNAP benefits (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known as Food Stamps), affecting 768 household members. Nevada has a relatively low rate of participation in this program and has been identified as one of the 10 worst states for seniors who lack the funds to purchase sufficient food for themselves. With the ongoing steep increase in rental costs in our area and the steadily increasing cost of food and gasoline, seniors and others on fixed incomes are struggling to get by.


